Professional Statement

I am currently working on the neglected but important philosophy of Salomon Maimon. First of all, the details of his work have never been properly understood. Second, I find his work, as it culminates in the *Essay on a New Logic or Theory of Thinking*, to be an important locus for exploring the origin and intersection of the various philosophical disciplines, centrally those of logic, metaphysics, philosophy of science and mathematics, ethics, aesthetics, and the philosophy of right, together in a theory of philosophical reflection. This work on Maimon has opened up a new perspective on the work of Immanuel Kant. I believe that if we take Kant as a philosopher who was just as concerned with the justification of formally valid logical reasoning as any metaphysician from Aristotle to Wolff, we can understand better the individual arguments of the *Critique of Pure Reason*, their interconnection in a whole argument, and its metaphysical significance. At a more personal level, I relate this work to my time in the military and in the unfortunate war in Iraq, and I believe, as Kant, Maimon, Fichte, and many other people have believed, that it is important to advocate for individual philosophical reflection. This inspires my teaching, whether it is on Plato, logic, medieval philosophy, or any subject whatever.
